Application for Quota Transfer

Quota belongs to the board. The Ontario Farm Products Marketing Commission has delegated to Chicken Farmers of Ontario the authority to cancel and to fix and allot quota. The board transfers quota by Regulation made under the Farm Products Marketing Act by cancelling the basic quota fixed and allotted to the transferor in respect of registered premises and fixing and allotting a like amount of quota to the transferee in respect of premises of which the transferee is the beneficial owner.

Transferors and transferees may apply to the board for quota transfer by delivering Form 117 to the board office. Form 117 is a joint Application for Quota Transfer.

In Part I, the transferor provides the board with information needed to determine whether the transferor is entitled to make the application. Other information requested helps the board maintain its producer database.

Similarly, in Part II the transferee provides the board with information needed to determine whether the transferee is entitled to have basic quota fixed and allotted to him or her. This Part is particularly important where the transferee is a new producer or where the transferee is building a new barn or an addition to an existing barn on a registered premises or on another premises.

In Part III of Form 117, the two parties provide information with respect to the proposed quota transfer. Such information includes the names of the parties, the number of basic quota units to be transferred, the location of the registered premises in respect of which the basic quota currently is fixed and allotted, the location of the premises in respect of which the transferred basic quota is to be fixed and allotted, and the crop quota period in which the transfer is to be effective.

The transferor and transferee must complete the application as fully as possible. Any questions or concerns should be referred to the board office. Please call Mr. Frank Fortuna, Quota Management Administrator, at (905) 637-0025, extension 245.

Quota transfers are a two step process. First, upon receipt of an application that complies with board Policy, the board will consider approval in principle of the application for quota transfer. Following approval in principle, the parties will be notified in writing that the application has been approved in principle. The requirements for final approval, including the appropriate transfer assessment, will be detailed. Upon compliance with the requirements for final approval, the board will consider a Regulation whereby the quota will be transferred. Again, both parties are notified in writing of final approval of the quota transfer.

Note that the board will not consider final approval of any application for quota transfer until the transferor has filed a statement and authorization in Form 118.

Note that the board will not consider final approval of any application for quota transfer until the transferor has filed a statement and authorization in Form 118.

¹ where the transfer of quota includes the registered premises or where the transaction is a non-arm's length transaction, this need not be completed.

² if you have acquired basic quota without premises within the last six crop quota periods, you may not apply to transfer any basic quota without premises.
